Students of all skill levels are encouraged to apply to participate, either individually, or in a team. Apps are judged by the following criteria: Quality of the Idea (How creative is the app? How original is it? Does the app address a problem? If so, how creative is the solution?), Implementation of the Idea (Did the student consider the user experience? Did the student give thought to the app design?),

The submitted apps will be judged by a panel of local judges who work within the academic, software, and entrepreneurial fields. The app of the winning student or team will be displayed in a US Capitol exhibit. Please encourage your child to participate if he or she is interested in programming or app coding.

STEM Essay Contest Junior and Senior Girls Only!

The Governor and the VA Council on Women has announced that they will

again hold the STEM essay contest for female juniors and seniors who are interested in pursuing a STEM field. The Council will award five \$5000 scholarships, one in each VA region. To be eligible, one must be a female who resides in VA, be a junior or senior in high school, and hold at least a 2.5 GPA. The essays will be judged by a panel of women who currently hold a degree in a STEM field. Entries must be submitted by February 8, 2016.
