Computer Science Education Week Hour of Code

Next week marks the annual campaign for tens of millions of students to try an "hour of code." In celebration of Computer Science Education Week, December 7-13, Disney's Frozen, Legos, Minecraft, or even Star Wars to program adventures of the characters and work through the basics of game programming. Students in

Computer science helps nurture problem-solving skills, logic, and creativity, and is a large part of STEM career fields. Hour of Code activities are self-guided, and options are available for every age and experience level, from kindergarten and up. Hour of Code is organized by Code.org, a non-profit organization dedicated to offering computer science to more schools around the country. Students are able to choose an area of interest, like
