Right: In the RCES STEAM Lab, fourth graders learned about how engineers are working to improve the lives of people with missing limbs by using 3D printers to create bionic arms. The bionic arms have sensors which attach to the user's skin to detect the user's muscle movements, which can be used to control the hand and open and close the fingers. After watching a short video, students created their own robotic hand models with strings to mimic the sensors in the bionic arms.

## Hands-on Learning

Left: Students in Mrs. Fincham's Small Animal Care and Veterinary Science courses immersed themselves in a variety of hands-on learning. Since proper restraint techniques are crucial with handling and working with animals, students learned how to restrain cats and dogs in both lateral and sternal recumbency, apply a properly fitting muzzle, and place a catin a catbag. The students also practiced bathing techniques on dogs and even a horse. Stormy, a horse, patiently allowed the Veterinary Science students to learn how to apply regular halter and rope halter. Afterwards, she was rewarded with a long bath, massage, and attention from all the students.
