# Meet Dr. Gary Blair

RCPS HR Director Becomes Interim Superintendent

On Tuesday, February 21st, the Rappahannock County School Board appointed current Human Resources (HR) Director, Dr. Gary Blair, as Interim Superintendent following the resignation of Dr. Donna Matthews. Dr. Blair

has 40 years of educational experiences under his belt, including serving as superintendent of schools in two other counties, building administrator at the elementary, middle, and secondary level, and central office assistant superintendent. As the



current HR Director of RCPS, he already has experience with Rappahannock faculty and staff, as well as local procedures for hiring and recruiting staff, issuing contracts, overseeing grievance procedures and due process, and budget implications. Already, in his first few days as interim, he has met with executive staff to establish his expectations for leadership moving forward, as well as processes for immediate enhancement. He also met with teachers to gather information about the current perception of division needs. Dr. Blair is dedicated to maintaining the high standards RCPS demands in its instructional program, and looks forward to working with the school and community in this capacity. RCPS thanks Dr. Blair for taking on this very important position during this time of transition.

#### **Special Education Disability Spotlight: Speech-Language Impairment**

The ability to communicate is something we often take for granted; yet, it is the cornerstone of the learning process. Being able to understand information that is presented as well as express our understanding of that information is essential to successful educational performance as well as self-efficacy. Speech-Language Impairment is one of the major disability categories that is considered when a student is displaying academic difficulty. Indicators that a student may have a delay in this area include difficulty pronouncing words, fluency issues, such as stuttering, vocal quality concerns, such as hoarseness, limited vocabulary, and difficulty understanding language or concepts. RCPS is fortunate to have Nancy Jinkins as our full-time Speech Language Pathologist, as well as her capable Speech Assistant, Kristen Frazier. These ladies serve identified students in grades Pre-K through 12 who require speech-language instruction either as a primary/secondary disability or as a related service. Speech support ranges from individual to small group instruction in a self-contained setting to inclusive assistance in the general education classroom. As part of our on-going Child Find efforts, speech screenings are available free of charge for students who may be at-risk for a delay or who demonstrate indicators of concern.
