self, peers, learning, and failures. Growth mindset is based on the work of Carol Dweck. Her studies showed drastic differences in student achievement when students connected their intelligence with hard work and effort, rather than feeling as though their intelligence was simply a bestowed gift. Dweck conducted experiments in which simply changing the way students were praised changed the way they performed. For example, students who were praised with phrases such as "you are so smart," performed at a

only did students who were praised for effort outperform those who were praised for intelligence, the former outperformed the latter in terms of grit as well. That is to say that they were more willing to try difficult problems since they were unafraid of failure. RCES GT students watched videos, participated in brainstorming and critical thinking questions, as well as set goals for themselves, changing the world "failure" to "experiment," with the understanding that you need to fail to learn. They
