
Performance report at advisory

On Wednesday, March 9th, the Career and Technical Education Advisory met to review prior year performance targets for the CTE Program at the high school. The CTE department exceeded its prior year goals of improving participation and pass rates for all students in CTE courses taking the Workplace Readiness exam.

The only target missed by a narrow margin was the special population's competency attainment rate. The group talked about looking into additional opportunities to provide more advanced certifications for students in Career and Tech

classes. Currently, students are attaining VA Work Place Readiness, OSHA 10, NOCTI, WISE Financial Literacy, MOS, and Nursing Aide certifications.

A more comprehensive review of the Career and Technical Education Program will take place at the April 12<sup>th</sup> School Board meeting. Performance targets are reviewed annually in order to set goals and maintain the federal Perkins grant.
