Food preservation activities

Over the past few weeks, Farm-to-Table students have been studying food origins, seasonal yields, and food preservation. As part of these studies, Farm-to-Table Coordinator, Sarah Moore, had students prepare an organic salsa treat before getting back to work in the Young Garden.



Preceding this discussion, students learned about climate zones, annual/perennial plants, local food, and imports as background information to understanding processes surrounding the preservation of foods over distances.
