New Online Economics and Personal Finance Course through Longwood College credit before 8th grade!!

An exciting opportunity has become available to students at RCHS. A partnership with Longwood University will allow for high school students requirement for both the economics and personal finance course and virtual course, as well as provide students to earn three

to take an online summer course to earn college credit. As many of you know, new Virginia state regulations require that all students in high school must take at least one virtual course as well as an economics and personal finance course in order to graduate.

Longwood University has agreed to offer a four week Economics and Personal Finance online course that will not only count for high school graduation credit, it will fulfill the graduation official college credits. Better yet, if students opt to attend Longwood upon graduation, an additional three credits will be applied as a scholarship. Thus, one student can earn up to six college credits in four weeks.

This course is self-paced interface. This is a very viable option for gifted students looking to take a high school credit over the summer that will fulfill two graduation requirements in one. The course is entirely Enrichment Opportunity
