Keynote Speaker Joe Showker Joe Showker is an innovator in the field of digital ethics and internet safety throughout Virginia and the nation. He served on the VA DOE committee to craft the Virginia "Guide to Internet Safety in Virginia Schools"- the nation's first internet safety school curriculum. Recently, he served on the Virginia DOE/CTE Curriculum Development for Cyber Security Instruction. He collaborated with the Institute for Infrastructure and Information Assurance at JMU in developing a Cyber Citizens Guide for Virginia schools. His early 2000s classroom was the southeastern U.S. rollout for the game "Missing," an immersion experience for teaching internet safety. His presentations and training provide insight on Digital Ethics including professional digital ethics, curricular instruction, and social media. He's recently been named to assist the CTE VA state educational program craft guidelines for internet security instruction.
