Summer Quest 2015

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Five middle school students from RCPS were able to attend the Summer Regional Governor's School, hosted by Emerald Hill Elementary School in Culpeper. This year's theme was "Law and Order" where students were able to engage in hands-on, real-life projects and activities in order to solve mysteries. The featured classes available for students to take were, drama ("How to Get Away with Murder"), history ("Every Which Way But Loose"), English ("Law & Order: Special Fiction Unit"), art ("The Art of Crime") or science (CSI SQ!). As part of the experience, students attended a field trip to the Crime and Punishment Museum in D.C. and were also able to attend an assembly with an FBI forensic psychologist.
