NEW MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

RCHS Students Mentor Underclassmen

As the high school welcomes the class of 2016, they are ready to assist students transitioning with the implementation of a new, exciting program, the "8th Grade Academy." The academy will serve to create a school within a school, serving as a bridge between the middle and high school to ease the transition and make the process far less stressful for students and far more rewarding. The four key components of the Academy are providing social support, providing academic support and high school preparedness, providing career and college readiness, and connecting parents, community and school. Monthly activities designed to address all four components are planned, with several already accomplished or underway. Ms. Dani Pond has launched a new 8th Grade Academy Facebook page which provides a window into the world of 8th grade along with supplying timely reminders to parents about school activities. In partnership with 4-H, dozens of our juniors and seniors have applied to become 8th grade student mentors. These mentors will be paired up with 8th graders to provide peer support throughout the year. Those student mentors underwent a day long training session at the Northern Virginia 4H Educational Center, led by Jenny Kapsa from 4-H, Kathy Zehr Rhodes, and Dani Pond from RCPS, and are ready, willing, and able to begin providing leadership to their younger mentees.

Rappahannock County Public Schools is committed to engaging parents as valued partners in the education of our students who present with unique learning challenges. In conjunction with Virginia Regulations Governing the Special Education Programs for Children with Disabilities (2010), the Special Education Advisory Committee of Rappahannock County Public Schools (SEAC of RCPS) consists of parents, community members, school staff, and representatives of other groups who meet a minimum of four times each school year to participate in the development of priorities and strategies for meeting the identified needs of children with disabilities that will support the intellectual, social, physical, and emotional needs of this special population in coordination with local agencies and support groups. An initial meeting has been scheduled for Sept. 15, 2016 at 6:00 at the RCES cafeteria. The agenda will include an overview of the Imagine Learning Reading Program, as well as, planning for future meetings. Students are welcome to attend for adult-supervised time on the playground.
