Royal Live Oaks, city staff prep for summer installation

The city of Hardeeville teamed up May 30 with Royal Live Oaks Academy to assemble recently purchased street signs for downtown.

Ninth-grade students and city staff put together about 80 signs in 45 minutes.

Downtown development manager Chris Damgen began working on the intersection sign project in January as requested by City Council, which approved the signs at its April 3 meet-
