They should have a valuable knowledge of the Introductory Rites, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist and will soon discover the history and details of the Communion Rite and Concluding Rite. <u>ANGEL TREE FOR 2017</u> - The Angel Tree project has benefitted so many of our parish children during the holidays with assistance for gifts, clothing, etc. and served children from our community when the need has been determined. If you are aware of a family within our parish who could use some help for their children, please contact the church office and complete confidentiality will be used to make certain the matter remains private.

CHISTOPHER COLUMBUS STAUTE: Within the next week we will be receiving a statue of Christopher Columbus. The statue is 7 ½ ft. tall and stands on a pedestal. It is made of Carrara marble (the same marble Michelangelo used on the Pieta) and will be placed on the hill to the right as you come into the church campus, above the Shamrock. The Italian Heritage Society owns the statue that was a gift to the Society from the Joseph Bruno Foundation. Mr. Bruno commissioned the Italian Sculptor, Ugo Sordelli to carve the statue in time for the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the discovery of America and was unveiled on the grounds of UAB in October of 1992. The statue is here at St. Patrick temporarily. It will be returned to the Italian American Heritage Society when they move into their new location. We thank the Society for choosing St. Patrick to house their statue while this process is completed.
