Lenten Day of Service (or LDOS) is a day set aside each year during Lent for our Parish family to come together to serve the Lord through Fellowship and through Service.

Never been to LDOS? Here is what to expect.

#### FELLOWSHIP

There are many opportunities throughout the day (March 31, 2012) for Fellowship. During the refreshments offered at 7:30am before we begin our day, during the provided lunch we will share, as well as during the activities of the team you will be working with. Each of these affords the opportunity to meet someone new or get to know someone better. You never know how your life may be changed by this opportunity to fellowship with your parish family. At a previous LDOS a parishioner met someone new and later was asked to stand as a witness when they had there marriage blessed!

#### SERVICE

Service is the act of volunteering your time and talent and making a commitment to help keep St. Patrick a growing and vibrant "Jewel of the Diocese". Each LDOS we have teams of people who have signed up to work in particular areas of the Church campus. Each team has a team leader or co-leaders. After a light morning refreshment and an opening prayer these teams disperse to their assigned area and begin their ministry of service. General tasks include dusting, mopping, vacuuming, washing, polishing, and minor repairs throughout the Church and Family Life Center. Or you may be on a team working outside to help clean-up the grounds, garden, grotto, shrine or parking lots. Yet another group ministers by helping to feed the hungry workers. Of course this could not happen with out the dedication of two parishioners who volunteer to spearhead this Lenten project each year; Phillip Troha and Rob Smith.

Some questions you may have are; How do I sign up? Can I Choose the team I want to work with? Do I need to bring anything with me? These are good questions and we are so glad you asked!
