

# Seaside School District 10

## Admission of Nonresident Students

As facilities and personnel permit, the superintendent may authorize conditional admissions of students whose parents or guardians live outside the boundaries of the District. Such admissions are subject to procedures established and set forth in administrative regulations and in the following policy.

### 1. Non-High School District Students

Students in grades nine through twelve from non-high school Districts which pay tuition as determined by the District may be admitted. Such tuition will be the per student cost of operating the high school. Costs for services required by an Individualized Educational Program (IEP) for students identified as handicapped will be the responsibility of the resident District.

### 2. Tuition Admission of Nonresident Students

Nonresident students may be permitted to attend schools upon payment of tuition under the following conditions:

- a. Adequate space and appropriate staff are available for the grade/class requested.
- b. Assumption of transportation responsibilities is accepted by the parent/guardian.
- c. Nonresident students whose behavior is judged by the superintendent to be unsatisfactory will be denied continued enrollment and will be refunded a proportionate amount of tuition.
- d. Tuition payments shall be paid in advance on a quarterly basis with the tuition charge being based on the per student operating cost, plus any special services cost. Failure to make such payments will result in prompt exclusion of the student.

### 3. Admission of Nonresident Students by Agreements With Other Districts

Extenuating circumstances may arise where the superintendents of the Districts agree that attendance of a student in other than the resident District would be in the best interest of that student. In such cases, the two Districts may enter into agreement, whereby the student becomes a resident of the District in which he/she attends for purposes of the receipt by that District of State School Fund moneys. An admission will be rescinded upon noncompliance with the District's policies.

### 4. Admission of Former Residents' Students

A student whose parents move from the District after he/she has satisfactorily completed the junior year may petition the superintendent to complete the senior year, tuition free. This decision will be based on the student's behavioral record and any special costs beyond those of the average cost per student.

Students in all other grades, whose parents move from the District during the second half of a school year and who have prior approval of the superintendent of the attending District, may remain in the school enrollment for the remainder of the school year without payment of tuition. Continuation of enrollment, as described, will be subject to the criteria noted in item 2, b. and c.

5. Admission of Future Resident's Students

Students in grades kindergarten through twelve, whose parents will become residents of the District, may be admitted to the school without payment of tuition upon submission of satisfactory evidence to the superintendent that residency will occur within 45 days of the student's enrollment date. This deadline may be extended by the superintendent when circumstances merit such consideration.

6. Admission of Students Residing With Other Than Parents/Guardians

Students under eighteen (18) years of age who become residents, as defined in ORS 339.115(3) will be enrolled as resident students without tuition being assessed. Verification of such placement shall be presented to the building principal prior to the student being enrolled.

Unemancipated students under eighteen (18) years of age requesting District enrollment and claiming residency, which is other than that of his/her parent, will be required to provide to the superintendent a court-approved document showing evidence of a guardianship relation with the adult at the claimed residence, or other satisfactory proof of parental relationship. In either case, such residency may not be for the purpose of attending school in the District. Under such conditions, the students must be a regular continuous resident at the stated address, or continued enrollment will be denied with the student returning to the home District, unless tuition payments are made to the District.

The District will review, confirm and retain a copy of all documents if enrollment of nonresident students is granted under the above policy.
