- 3. Radon** - OAR 581-022-2223(5)(c) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include a plan to test for elevated levels of radon as required under ORS 332.167.

- 4. Lead in Drinking water** - *OAR 581-022-2223(5)(d) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include a plan to test for and reduce exposure to lead in water used for drinking or food preparation.*

District's Objectives:

- 1. Identify sources of lead:** Annually, the District will test taps used for drinking or food preparation in the schools to identify any lead problems. The District will establish a written list of the test sites. Annually, the District will reference the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) and the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) for guidance on correct procedures and protocols. Currently, the recommendation is to reference the Environmental Protection Agency's 3 T's (EPA 3T) Revised Technical Guidance to ensure that samples for lead are collected properly and from the right places. The District will use an OHA-accredited drinking water laboratory to analyze samples for lead.
 - 2. Stop access:** The District will prevent access to water taps that have more than 20 parts per billion (ppb) of lead.
 - 3. Communicate:** The District will make results from tests for lead in water available to students, families, and the community: www.seaside.k12.or.us | School Safety | Lead Information.
 - 4. Mitigate and correct:** The District will make all efforts to mitigate and correct any issues relating to unacceptable levels of lead in the schools. Again, the EPA 3T's Guidance will be referenced for guidance.
- 5. Lead Paint** - *OAR 581-022-2223(5)(e) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include a plan to reduce exposure to lead paint that includes the following compliance with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule.*

In order to comply with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule, the District will contract with certified lead based paint renovation contractors licensed by the Oregon Construction Contractors Board and will always try to have a District staff that is certified by the Oregon Health Authority to perform work. An annual training will also be assigned to maintenance and custodial staff regarding lead awareness.

- 6. Integrated Pest Management** - *OAR 581-022-2223(5)(f) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include a plan to implement integrated pest management (IPM) practices as required under ORS 634.700 through 634.750.*

The District has adopted an integrated pest management plan as required by ORS 634.700 through 634.750. Community members can access a copy of the IPM plan:

An annual training will also be assigned to all staff.

7. **Communication** - *OAR 581-022-2223(5)(g) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include a plan to communicate results for all tests performed in accordance with the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan.*

The District will make all test results and detailed information explaining the test results available to the public within five business days of receiving the results. Results will be made available by posting the results on the District website, over the District's electronic communication system and available in hardcopy at the District Office (1801 S Franklin Street, Seaside, OR 97138).
