## **School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter**

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2012-2013 educational progress for Shelby Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact the school office for assistance.

The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting the following web site <http://www.shelbypublicschools.net/> or you may review a copy in the principal's office at your child's school.

The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the top 30% and the bottom 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

A key challenge for the school is to address the learning needs of all our students in a manner that will allow more students to demonstrate proficiency on Michigan Educational Assessment Program tests. Data in the AER indicates that some of our subgroups are not performing as well as others. To address this gap the school is introducing more elective classes that address academic content standards in language arts, mathematics, science and social studies. Additionally, some students will be assigned to take two periods of mathematics or two periods of language arts over the course of the school year.

State law requires that we also report additional information. Shelby Middle School is the only middle school in the district. All sixth, seventh and eighth grade students attending school in the district attend Shelby Middle School.

1. The school improvement plan has been updated to include student achievement goals in language arts, mathematics, science and social studies.
2. Shelby Middle School does not have any specialized schools.
3. Parents can access a copy of the core curriculum, a description of its implementation and an explanation of the variances from the state's model by contacting the school office.
4. Shelby Middle School began administering the Measures of Academic Progress tests during the school year 2012-13. The following chart displays beginning of the year national norms (mean scores) and beginning of the year mean scores for Shelby Middle School.
