ST. JOHN OF GOD COMMUNITY SERVICES HOSTS RESOURCE FAIR FOR FAMILIES OF TRANSITIONING STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

(Westville, NJ) – For the parents or caregivers of a loved one with special needs, graduation can be a time of great joy but also great anxiety. It is during this time that many questions can arise regarding continued care for a loved one and what the future may hold. In an effort to help parents navigate through this process, St. John of God Community Services (SJOGCS) will host their second annual *Making the Transition Resource Fair* on **Saturday, November 3**rd from **11am to 2pm**.

This event is the first of its kind in the area, as it specifically focuses on the invaluable resources needed for families to successfully transition their loved ones from high school to the community/workforce. Representation will include those from support coordinating agencies, vocational rehabilitation and day programs, legal/guardianship services, financial planning services, state disability programs and vocational services.

According to Archbishop Damiano School (ADS) social worker, Alicia Gilbert, the need for this event was made apparent to the organization by the families of ADS, a grades K – 12 special needs school under SJOGCS's umbrella of disability services. This event is open to the entire special needs community, including educators and child study teams, as SJOGCS recognizes the need across all services and locations.

"A lot of parents begin to think about transition planning when their loved one is between the ages of 14 and 16, but then time passes quickly," Gilbert said. "Transition is a process that takes time and consideration. It is when families think about the hopes and dreams for their child after they graduate, look into options in the community and develop a plan to meet those goals."

Gilbert added that as a student nears 18 years old, families may want to consider pursuing guardianship or power of attorney. She recommends at this time to reapply for SSI/Medicaid, if the individual was not eligible previously due to household income, and to look into financial planning as well as what type of services in the community will best meet the student's needs after they graduate.

Making the Transition Resource Fair is just one in a number of initiatives created through ADS's newly formalized transition program. This program assists the families of students enrolled at ADS in planning for life after graduation.

"Transition is not only about finding the appropriate placement for students and adults with special needs, it is more about the quality of one's life," Brother Thomas Osorio, O.H, executive director of SJOGCS, said.

This event is free and open to all families in the community. The resource fair will be held in the ADS gymnasium on St. John of God Community Services' campus, located at 1145 Delsea Drive in Westville.
