FROM OUR PASTOR

Continued Advent blessings, and also especially today: Blessed Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, everyone! And Blessed Solemnity of St. John of the Cross on Tuesday! We are all delighted and grateful that the Catholic Market event a week ago went so well, and we are hoping to bring it back more often. We are also thanking the Trinity for the new Catholic Professionals group that meets on the second Saturday of the month.

To help stir up our hearts to greater hope and gratitude for how much our invisible family desires to help and protect and heal us, here are the words of Our Lady of Guadalupe to St. Juan Diego on December 9 and December 12, 1531, in Mexico City:

"Know, know for sure, my dearest, littlest, and youngest son, that I am the perfect and ever Virgin Holy Mary, Mother of the God of truth, through Whom everything lives, the Lord of all things near us, the Lord of Heaven and earth. I want very much to have a little house built here for me, in which I will show Him, I will exalt Him, and make Him manifest. I will give Him to the people in all my personal love, in my compassion, in my help, in my protection: because I am truly your merciful Mother, yours and all the people who live united in this land and of all the other people of different ancestries, my lovers, who love me, those who seek me, those who trust in me. Here I will hear their weeping, their complaints, and heal all their sorrows, hardships, and sufferings. And to bring about what my compassionate and merciful concern is trying to achieve, you must go to the residence of the Bishop of Mexico and tell him that I sent you to show him how strongly I wish him to build me a temple here on the plain; you will report to him exactly all you have seen, admired, and what you have heard.

"Know for sure I will appreciate it very much, be grateful, and reward you. And you? You will deserve very much the reward I will give you for your fatigue, the work and trouble that my mission will cause you. Now, my dearest son, you have heard my breath, my word; go now and put forth your best effort. Listen, put it into your heart, my youngest and dearest son, that the thing that disturbs you, the thing that afflicts you, is nothing. Do not let your countenance, your heart be disturbed. Do not fear this sickness of your uncle or any other sickness, nor anything

that is sharp or hurtful. Am I not here, I, who am your Mother? Are you not under my shadow and protection? Am I not the source of your joy? Are you not in the hollow of my mantle, in the crossing of my arms? Do you need anything more? Let nothing else worry you, disturb you. Do not let your uncle's illness worry you, because he will not die now. You may be certain that he is already well."

[And at that moment the uncle was restored to health, as they were to learn later.]

I ask Our Lady of Guadalupe to bless each one of you and your families, and to inspire you to get a copy of her image to put up in your home. She has healed many of her sons and daughters, simply through reverence for this greatest of all Marian images! (It is the only ongoing miraculous image on the planet, since it is made out of cactus fibers that should have rotted by 1581.)

Fasting from the Wound of Confusion

PAUSE TO HEAR GOD SPEAK:

"He is not the God of disorder [confusion] but of peace." -1 Corinthians 14:33

"But if any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly, and he will be given it." -James 1:5 Today I choose to fast from the wound of confusion. The story of Adam and Eve gives us the perfect analogy to understand our sin. In Genesis, the fruit that Adam and Eve eat represents sin. If our own sin is fruit, it also grows on a tree, and that tree has roots. Our sin is a reaction to something that happens deeper inside of us—as our roots. These roots are made up of our experiences, emotions, beliefs, and thoughts and are separate from God's love and care for us. Let's take a moment to zero in on this idea by looking at the wound of confusion. Using our tree analogy, we can see that confusion is a primary root of the sin of sloth. In other words, sloth is our reaction to being confused. If you've ever been sure you should make a right turn while driving, only to find out you really should have turned left, that is confusion. Confusion happens inside us—it is a disorientation of our minds, emotions, or

hearts. It might feel to you like you have a thick fog in your head. It might also feel like a rapid back-andforth in your thoughts. just can't figure out the right direction We or the right thing to do. Confusion will keep us from making a decision or lead us toward a bad decision. Confusion is at the root, but sloth is the fruit. Working with the reflection below, take a few moments to ponder the presence of confu sion in your life.

> Take time to ask yourself... What types of thoughts and feelings tend to confuse me? How do I react when I experience confusion?

Pray slowly... Heavenly Father, In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, I renounce confusion and repent all the ways in which I have sinned because of it, particularly the ways in which I have rejected your wisdom and peace. I reject every form of confusion in my life. I renounce any lies I have come to believe, including lies such as, "I don't know what to do," "I'll make a mistake," or "I don't know where to turn." Send your Holy Spirit to heal, restore, and transform me. Amen.

A Theology of the Body

REJOICE IN THE LORD ALWAYS...

Today is known as Gaudete—Rejoice—Sunday; the day's Latin nickname is taken from today's ancient official Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." The optional rose vestments reminiscent of winter's early morning skies as the solstice draws near, the festal organ music, the floral arrangements, all these ancient traditions, together with the antiphon, are meant to anticipate, in sight and sound, the soon-to-break-uponus Christmas joy. How well today's scriptures illustrate the struggle between Advent's contrasting moods: "joyful expectation" in light of Christ's nativity, and "serious repentance" inspired by John the Baptist's preaching, reminding us that Christ's next coming—at death or at the end of time—will be for judgment as well as redemption.

Joy and exultation ring through the first reading, as Zephaniah's ancient messianic prophecy pictures God "rejoicing over us with gladness, renewing us in His love, singing joyfully because of us, as one sings at festivals." This joyful God is not distant: the prophet declares twice that God "is in your midst." Zephaniah so trusts this joyful God's love for us that he declares our deliverance "a done deal": both from inward fear and guilt—"the Lord has removed the judgment against you"—and from external threats: "He has turned away your enemies." The Responsorial Psalm, from Advent's principal prophet, Isaiah, echoes an exultant joy that should prompt us to be "confident and unafraid," "for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel." Paul likewise exhorts the Philippians—and us—to joy, to a kindness that should be evident to all, to prayer free from anxiety, serene and thankful.

But then John the Baptist cries out on Jordan's bank: Repent! Prepare for a Messiah whose baptism "with the Holy Spirit and fire," unlike John's water baptism, will utterly transform its recipients. His winnowing fan will clear away the dead wood, bundling wheat and burning chaff in unquenchable fire. If this is going to be "good news" for us, then well might we, like the crowds, tax collectors, and soldiers who first heard John, ask

"What should we do?" When John responds to the people then, and to us today, the answer, while supremely challenging, is almost surprisingly simple. Nobody is ordered to abandon the place in which their personal life's journey or the realities of a history beyond their control have put them. God saves us not despite or apart from our real-life circumstances but in them and through them. Our call now is to practical, generous charity: we are to share clothing and food; practice justice and professional and personal integrity; and be honest toward others and with ourselves. Such is the teaching of the Messiah that John heralded.
