FROM OUR PASTOR


Christ is born for us!


P. S. Here is a little Christmas story called, "For Always," by Will Fish:



Fasting from the Wound of False-Burden Bearing

PAUSE TO HEAR GOD SPEAK:

"Each will bear his own load" (Galatians 6:5).

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves.

For my yoke is easy, and my burden light" (Matthew 11:28-30).

Today I choose to fast from the wound of false-burden bearing. If you're a parent, at some point you've likely been more concerned about your children being ready for a big test than they themselves were. You might have hovered over

them or badgered them to study and prepare. Your concern and personal investment were far greater than theirs. This is an example of false-burden bearing. We might justify it as mercy or diligence, but we are really taking on the cares, concerns, and responsibilities that rightly belong to someone else. This wound can masquerade as compassion, but it's really a form of confusion: "I cannot tell the difference between what is mine and what is yours."

At deeper levels of hurt, abuse victims will blame themselves for what was done to them, or family members will blame themselves for a loved one's suicide. False-burden

bearing often connects to other faulty beliefs and emotions related to guilt and shame. It is a form of codependency, where we believe that we are somehow responsible for the outcomes of other peoples decisions, and we will do everything in our power to save the other person. Let's work through this a little bit as we reflect on the passages in the dark green box above and then recite the prayer below.

Pray slowly... Heavenly Father, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, I renounce false-burden bearing and repent all the ways in which I have sinned because of it, particularly in not loving authentically and by getting in the way of your work. I reject all forms of false-burden bearing in my life. I renounce any lies that I have come to believe, including lies such as "I can fix them" or "it's my responsibility." I renounce any companion emotions such as confusion and double-mindedness. Send your Holy Spirit to speak the truth to my heart that I might have the "mind of Christ" (1 Corinthians 2:16). Amen.

We told the children about Mary and Joseph arriving in Bethlehem. Finding no room in the inn, the couple went to a stable, where the baby Jesus was born and placed in a manger. Throughout the story, the children and orphanage staff sat in amazement as they listened. Some sat on the edges of their stools, trying to grasp every word. Completing the story, we gave the children three small pieces of cardboard to make a crude manger. Each child was given a small paper square cut from yellow napkins I had brought with me (no colored paper was available in the city). Following the instructions, the children tore the paper and carefully laid strips in the manger for straw. Small squares of flannel, cut from a wornout nightgown that an American lady threw away as she left Russia, were used for the baby's blanket. A doll-like baby was cut from tan felt that we had brought from the United States.

The orphans were busy assembling their mangers as I walked among them to see if they needed any help. All went well until I got to one table where little Misha sat—he looked to be about six years old and had finished his project. As I looked at the little boy's manger, I was startled to see not one, but two babies in the manger. Quickly, I called for the translator to ask the lad why there were two babies in the manger. Crossing his arms in front of him and looking at his completed manger scene, the child began to repeat the story very seriously. For such a young boy who had only heard the Christmas story once, he related the happenings accurately—until he came to the part where Mary put the baby Jesus in the manger. Then Misha started to ad-lib. He made up his own ending to the story as he said, "And when Mary laid the baby in the manger, Jesus looked at me and asked me if I had a place to stay. I told him I have no mama and I have no papa, so I don't have any place to stay. Then Jesus told me I could stay with Him. But I told Him I couldn't, because I didn't have a gift to give Him like everybody else did. But I wanted to stay with Jesus so much so I thought maybe if I kept Him warm that would be a good gift. So I asked Jesus, "If I keep you warm, will that be a good enough gift?" And Jesus told me, "If you keep me

warm, that will be the best gift anybody ever gave me." So, I got into the manger and then Jesus looked at me and told me I could stay with Him—for always."

As little Misha finished his story, his eyes brimmed full of tears that splashed down his little cheeks. Putting his hand over his face, his head dropped to the table and his shoulders shook as he sobbed and sobbed. The little orphan had found someone who would never abandon nor abuse him, someone who would stay with him—for always.

From *The Living Flame of Love*By St. John of the Cross

During this time of the betrothal and expectation of marriage and the anointings of the Holy Spirit, when the ointments preparatory for union with God are more

with God are more sublime, the anxieties of the caverns of the soul are usually extreme and delicate.

Since these ointments are a more proximate preparation for union with God (for they are more closely related to God and consequently lure the soul and make it relish Him more delicately), the desire for Him becomes more refined and profound—and the desire for God is the preparation for union with God.



DID YOU NOT KNOW?

A child's first words are usually a source of excitement and joy for family members. Today we hear the first words of Jesus in the Gospel according to Luke. And they are challenging ones. "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?"

The words "astounded," "astonished," and "great anxiety" are used to describe Jesus' extended visit to the Temple. How familiar those emotions are to most parents! Had Jesus' parents forgotten the angel Gabriel's words or the prophecy of Simeon? In Luke's Gospel this passage foreshadows Jesus' final journey to Jerusalem where He will experience His own

Passover and again be "lost" for three days. The story of Hannah in the first reading confirms the need and nature of trusting in God's activity in our lives. It seems clear that faithful attention to a family's spiritual life is no guarantee that life will be free from hardship.
