PRESENTATION ON CHILD SAFETY AND THE INTERNET

MEETING THE CHALLENGES OF "TODAY'S INTERNET & TECHNOLOGY SAFETY" AWARENESS PRESENTATION: On Monday, February 10, at 7:00 p.m., in the Parish Hall, Tracy Webb, Senior Trial Attorney in charge of the Child Abuse Prevention Division of the L.A. City Attorney's Office, will give a presentation on Cyber Crime Awareness and Prevention. This presentation will include information on online safety, Internet predators, social networking sites, Megan's law, sexting, cyber bullying, and computer safety. It is being hosted by St. Therese Parish, VIRTUS, and the Safeguard the Children Committee, in collaboration with the Office of the L.A. City Attorney.



In this age of technology, children can and <u>do</u> go online almost anywhere and anytime. They surf the Internet and send messages from home computers, friends' computers, libraries, schools, PDAs, Blackberries, iPhones, and cell phones. Internet-enabled video game systems allow them to contact and compete against and chat with players around the world. Cell phones enable kids to surf the web and exchange messages, photos, and short videos with just about anyone, anywhere. Allowing kids to go online without supervision, ground rules, or parental controls, is like allowing them to explore a major metropolitan city by themselves.

The Internet, like any large public area, offers an enormous array of entertainment and educational resources but also presents many risks, especially to children. They need help navigating this strange new world. You can't watch your children every minute so you need strategies to help them benefit from the vast resources of the web while avoiding the many risks. She is a career prosecutor who has spent a large part of her career prosecuting child abuse cases including physical, sexual, exploitation, and technologically facilitated crimes against children.

We highly encourage PARENTS, Educators, Catechists, and Ministry leaders to attend this powerful and enlightening workshop. Bring a notebook & pencil! No children please—adult content and material.

A CHRISTMAS REPRISE: The Church's


celebration three weeks ago of the Baptism of the Lord signaled

the "official" end of the Christmas season. However, you may have noticed that the nativity scene on the front porch of the Parish Offices was not put away at that time. We left it in anticipation of today's Feast of the Presentation of the Lord—which some have even called a "second Epiphany." Today's first reading recalls the anticipation of Advent, as Malachi

The reading from Hebrews reminds us of the Incarnation, proclaiming that Jesus had a "share" in our own "blood and flesh." The Gospel finds the infant Jesus on His first visit to Jerusalem and His human parents once again surprised and in awe over the events surrounding His birth. In the simplicity of the manger, in the grandeur of the temple, in the domesticity of Nazareth, Jesus comes. May we come to know Him and so be filled with "wisdom" and the "favor of God."
