





“How Long Does It Take To Become A Saint?: The Distraction of the Internet”—By Fr. Philip Sullivan, OCD

Ephphatha! Be open! At every baptism, the Church instructs the priest to bless the ears of the baby so that he or she will hear and recognize God’s Word. Then the priest is instructed to bless the baby’s mouth in order to proclaim the Gospel. After Baptism, all the senses are faculties of the soul. Yes, ALL the senses are instruments of the soul and have one purpose and one purpose only: To help us get to heaven.

Recently I came across an interesting question: “How long does it take to become a saint?” I’d like to answer it with another question: “How much time do you have left to live?” I believe these two questions should be pondered simultaneously because the second gives us motivation to live differently, to be reconciled with God and neighbor, to be more generous and forgiving, to pray more fervently, to be a better husband and father or a better wife and mother, to really take seriously why we should be saints. So, how long does it take to become a saint? Are you motivated to become a saint? Can thinking about our inevitable deaths motivate us to become saints? Ephphatha! BE OPEN!

These are daunting questions to ask. If we distract ourselves from answering them, we are closing our mouths to proclaiming the urgency of God’s love for the world and the salvation won for us by the death of Jesus Christ on the Cross. We are closing our ears to Jesus, who is prompting us to live like saints (“Be holy because I, the LORD your God, am holy” {Leviticus 19:2} and “Be perfect as my Father in Heaven is perfect” {Matt 5:48}). One distraction most of us have on a daily basis is one often brought up in the Confessional: the computer and its improper use.

Have you heard the word “Malware?” It’s short for malicious software and is used to corrupt computers and gather private information. It is also known as “worms, Trojan horses, ransomware, spyware, adware, scareware, etc. Like sin and bad habits, it is stealthy, secret, and very patient; it steals information and spies on you through the computer’s camera and is designed to cause harm and sabotage. It can even be used to extort payment! It remembers your passwords by recording repeated strokes on your keyboard. Like sin, malware is often disguised as something good and useful; but, like sin, malware is dangerous, and it has only one objective in the end: to destroy.

Malware is embedded in programs downloaded from “useful” websites. Like near occasions of sin, they only give the appearance of being useful and attractive, entertaining us in a variety of ways; but they have an ulterior motive. Like sin, that motive is to steal your identity! Malware is designed to watch you, to infect your devices, and to control your computers in other creepy ways. I’m not finished! Eventually, like sin, these silent and malicious viruses will join forces in your computers and launch a very sophisticated attack on the entire system! This is referred to as a “blended threat.” The bundled viruses can operate your computer, access the Internet and your pass codes, and—eventually—take over the whole network!

After reading this, I am sure there are some of you who are pretty nervous right now and can’t wait to take your computer to the Geek Squad. Maybe you’re thinking, “I’m just going to throw it away!”—and for some of you, you should throw your computers away—just as we’ve done at St. Therese Carmelite School. As many of you know, our Parish School has been going through a very necessary reform. We have new leadership, new teachers, new textbooks, new uniforms, and a new curriculum. What we don’t have is Common Core and computers. Our philosophy is that computers are unsustainable, as we have learned from the billion dollar blunder of LA Unified when they tried “generously” to provide iPads to the students. It was a disaster and was a hot topic for many months in the news. Our philosophy is that our children should learn how to read, write, speak, and THINK before a computer does it for them. If you want your children to learn about computers and explore the internet, they need to do it under parental supervision. The malware, the viruses, the Trojan horses, and the worms are not going to infect the minds, hearts, and souls of your children while they are attending St. Therese Carmelite School. Our School is determined to teach your children to explore the Bible—not the internet. Our School is determined to teach your children to be thinkers not “test takers.” Our school is determined to make saints. In the words of Mother Luisita, the Carmelite Nun who founded the Carmelite Sisters, “**WHAT WE HAVE TO DO IS BECOME SAINTS, TO PERFECT THE ORDINARY DEEDS OF DAILY LIFE AND LIVE ONLY FOR GOD...**”

Did you know that in a recent national survey, nearly half (47%) of US teens say their social life would end or be harmed without their cell phones; and that four out of five teens (17 million) carry wireless devices? Did you know that the American Psychiatric Association claims Smartphone addiction is often fueled by “Internet Use Disorder” or “IUD.” Smartphones allow our children to have continuous access to the internet, leading to an increasing addiction to the internet. Teens with IUD have measurable changes in the functions of their brains—mirroring what happens in those addicted to chemical substances like cocaine, tobacco, and alcohol.

At Baptism, God opens the soul to Sanctifying Grace. He opens the ears to hear His Word and opens the mouth to proclaim His Gospel. How can we be OPEN to God’s Word and to proclaim His Gospel of Love if we are addicted to technology? Is technology the “god” we turn to in our various needs? Doesn’t our obsession with technology rather close our relationship with God? Let’s make some changes in our lives so we can think about the things that really matter: Life, Death, and Eternity. “How long does it take to become a saint?” “How much time do you have to live?”


JOIN A CHOIR!


Presentation Chapel of Perpetual Adoration


