

Catholic Stewardship

What identifies a steward? First, it is generous giving of time, talent, and treasure. But being a Christian steward also means:

- Following Jesus, no matter what the cost;
- Being open to constant conversion and committing oneself to the Lord;
- Responding in a particular way as a disciple. Stewardship has the power to shape our lives by the way we live.

A good steward recognizes God as the origin of life and the source of all things. A good steward also shows gratitude for the gifts received and uses them to show love for God and for others (Matthew 22:36-40).

STEWARDS OF CREATION: God created the world and then entrusted it to human beings. Caring for it involves:

- Respect for human life from its natural conception until its natural end;
- Appreciation for the God-given beauty of nature AND protection and preservation of the environment; and
- Development of this world through noble human effort—physical labor, the trades and professions, the arts and sciences.

STEWARDS OF OUR VOCATIONS: Jesus calls us as his disciples to a new way of life. He calls us by name! Each of us—clergy, religious, lay person; married, single; adult, child—has a personal vocation. The challenge is to respond generously.

STEWARDS OF THE CHURCH: All stewards have their own roles to play in carrying out the redemptive mission of the church:

- Clergy, to bring the sacramental grace entrusted to them to the Faithful;
- Religious, to work in the ministries to which they have been appointed;
- Parents, to nurture their children in the light of faith;
- Parishioners, to work in concrete ways to make their parishes true communities of faith;
- Catholics, to give generous support to parish and diocesan programs.




"If God loves a cheerful giver, why are you supposed to give 'til it hurts?"

Through Faith Direct you can make all of your contributions to St. Therese Church via automatic payment from your checking account or credit card—just as you may do now with your mortgage, household bills, and other monthly payments. This is a great way to simplify your giving—as well as being very cost-effective and environmentally-friendly. Of course, it's voluntary!

It's simple to enroll in the program. **To do so, just follow these steps:**

1. Go to the home page of the St. Therese website (www.SaintThereseChurchAlhambra.org);
2. Click on the Faith Direct logo, which can be found at the top of the right column;
3. You will now find yourself on the Faith Direct online giving website.
4. Click "Enroll" from the links at the top of the page
 - Enter your name, contact information, and either your credit card information or your checking account information.
 - Enter your Church Envelope Number.
 - Choose from weekly or monthly donations, school donations, special collection donations, or one-time gifts.
 - Read the "WELCOME" information.

The next time that you go to the Faith Direct website (to make any changes or check your account, etc.), instead of clicking on "Enroll," click on "Sign In".

After completing these steps, you will no longer have to worry about writing checks, dealing with cash contributions, using your church envelopes or forgetting to bring your envelope with you to church. It's a win-win for you and for the parish!

Parish / School Maintenance

Although St. Therese Parish was established in 1924 and its first church built in 1926, our current church was built in 1950 by Earl Trudeau. The effective maintenance of the church over the last sixty-seven years has included not only routine cleaning and painting, but also attention to problems both seen and unseen in our foundations, support beams, insulation, electrical wiring, plumbing, and roofing—all of which are subject to gradual degradation. While it may be possible to ignore these problems for a period of time, eventually they will need attention.



For now, some of the improvements we would like to make include:

- ◆ Getting new doors for the side entrances of the church;
- ◆ Repainting the inside of the church;
- ◆ Installing canopies and artificial turf between the Parish Hall, the School, and the Parish Center to create more user-friendly space; and
- ◆ Rehabilitating the bathrooms in the Hall and the School.

Below are the estimated costs of these projects and the amount of donations we have received towards each to date:

The Parish Hall bathrooms have not been updated since the Hall and School classrooms were completed in 1963—**fifty-four years ago!** An early estimate we received for remodeling the six bathrooms was \$50,000 each.


