

Parish Vision Statement:

To be a spiritual Catholic Family focused on prayer as well as service to the Gospel through a Sacramental life. ATTENTION!

We need more Liturgical Ministers for our Weekend Masses!



Liturgy means the “*work of the people.*” Good liturgy is essential for the spiritual well-being of any faith community. For Catholics, the Mass is the central liturgy celebrated on a regular basis—offering the Eucharist as the most life-giving, regularly-received sacrament. Good liturgy takes good planning and preparation; good liturgy intentionally incorporates the varied gifts of the community, and reflects the fullness and universality of God’s Church.

Lectors: Generally speaking, a Sunday Mass requires two Lectors and the weekday Mass, one. Each lector is provided with a Workbook each November (prior to Advent) so to be able to practice sufficiently and become prayerfully familiar with the

readings at home. A lector reads slowly, clearly and deliberately, annunciating each word. Lectoring is not simply “reading”, it is proclaiming the Word of God!

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: Assist the “Ordinary” (which are priests, Deacons & older Altar servers) in the distribution of Holy Communion. The number of celebrants and clergy as well as the logistics of each Mass dictates the number of lay ministers needed. Generally speaking, the celebrant of the Mass and the concelebrant will distribute the Hosts in the center aisle. The best liturgical practice is to have Holy Communion offered under both species on Sundays.

Those serving as Extraordinary Ministers (E.M.) must come 15 minutes before Mass, sign-in, and check in with the Sacristan for any needs or changes. Each E.M. must retrieve and wear their E.M. tag. The assigned E.M.’s come forward into the Sanctuary at the beginning of the sign of peace and stand to the side of the Altar. If you are serving the cup, place the purificator on your arm. The Communion station for each E.M. is shown on the back of each tag. During Communion, the minister says, “The Body of Christ” or “The Blood of Christ,” clearly and with reverence when offering Communion to the faithful. The basic criterion for someone to serve as an Extraordinary Minister is that they need to be a Confirmed, “practicing” Catholic who is in good standing (confessed and able to also receive) and can serve with humility and reverence and be flexibility if there are any changes or special needs during the Mass. The number of E.M.s changes depending on the clergy in attendance.

It is not desirable to have people serve as both Lector and Extraordinary Minister at the same time/Mass unless absolutely necessary; it is best to understand the two roles as separate and distinct.

Ushers: The ushers serve two roles: first in welcoming the congregation with a warm smile and a kind word, and handing out bulletins at the end of Mass. They can also help people find a seat in the fuller Masses. In addition, they serve as the individuals who “handle the collection” during the offertory. They use the traditional stick-handled baskets and proceed throughout the congregation front to back, starting with the transepts. The center is not done until after the gifts are brought up. Two of the ushers also assist with the center aisle during Communion. Each Mass requires four ushers.

Sacristans: The sacristan is a person who will organize and prepare for the Mass—making available all the liturgical supplies needed for each Mass. This person is comfortable in finding the needed items in the sacristy of the church. Best liturgical practices dictate that all participants will arrive at least a half hour before Mass for set-up and preparations. Each Mass requires one Sacristan with two or three for larger Masses.

Altar Servers: Servers are boys in the Third Grade or higher who have made their First Holy Communion. They assist the priest at the Altar and attend regular training. The number of servers varies per Mass—from two up to seven at the larger Masses.

What is the Eucharist? Where is it Spoken of in the Bible?



Dr. Zell has been a parishioner of St. Therese Church since it was founded in 1924 (he was born in Los Angeles, California, on July 6, 1917). He attended St. Therese School and has the distinction of being the LAST remaining member of its FIRST graduating class (in 1929). He is a physician who practiced Family Medicine through the late 1990's; in fact, many of our parishioners were patients of his.

After graduating from St. Therese School, he continued his education at Cathedral High School, graduating from there in 1933, and then received his undergraduate degree at Santa Clara University. He went on to receive his medical degree in 1944 from Keck School of Medicine at the USC, and immediately began his practice in San Gabriel, California. On July 29, 1944, he married (Ada) Mary Jane Belzer (born in New York) at St. Therese Church. Their four children (Peter, Elizabeth Jane, Gretchen, and Gregory) were all baptized here at St. Therese and attended our school. After over 30 years of marriage, Dr. Zell's wife died on December 17, 1974 (he never remarried). For the last year or so, Dr. Zell has resided at Santa Teresita Manor (operated by the Carmelite Sisters of the Most Sacred Heart). Please keep him in your prayers! 


