

WHAT MASS DO YOU ATTEND? We are in serious need for more Liturgical Ministers, as follows:

Altar Boys: Needed at both Sat. 5 PM & Sun. 7:30 AM and 5 PM Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers: Needed at the Sat. 5 PM, Sun. 7:30, 9, 11 AM & 5 PM Lectors: Needed at Sat. 5 PM and Sun. 9 AM, 11 AM & 5 PM Sacristans: Needed at Sat. 5 PM and Sun. 7:30 AM & 5 PM, and at the weekday Masses

Ushers: Needed at ALL Masses

Liturgy means the "*work of the people*." Good liturgy is essential for the spiritual well-being of any faith community. Good liturgy takes planning and preparation; good liturgy intentionally incorporates the varied gifts of the community, and reflects the fullness and universality of God's Church. How do you assist at the Mass that you regularly attend? The priest cannot do it all alone, they need our help to ensure each Mass is assisted smoothly and reverently. Please consider how you give service to your Church!

<u>Lectors</u>: Generally speaking, a Sunday Mass requires two Lectors and the weekday Mass, one. Each A lector reads slowly, clearly and deliberately, annunciating each word. Lectoring is not simply "reading", it is proclaiming the Word of God!

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: Assist the "Ordinary" (which are priests, Deacons & older Altar servers) in the distribution of Holy Communion. Since the best liturgical practice is to have Holy Communion offered under both species on Sundays, we need multiple EMs. The basic criterion for someone to serve as an Extraordinary Minister (EM) is that they need to be a Confirmed, "practicing" Catholic who is in good standing (confessed and able to also receive) and can serve with humility and reverence and be flexibility if there are any changes or special needs during the Mass. Those serving as Extraordinary Ministers (E.M.) must come 15 minutes before Mass, sign-in, and check in with the Sacristan for any needs or changes. Each EM must retrieve and wear their tag. The assigned EMs come forward into the Sanctuary <u>at the beginning of *the sign of peace*</u> and stand to the side of the Altar. If serving the Cup, place the purificator on your arm. The Communion station for each EM is shown on the back of each tag. During Communion, the minister says, "The Body of Christ" or "The Blood of Christ," clearly and with reverence when offering Communion. The number of EMs changes depending on the clergy in attendance.

It is not desirable to have people serve as both Lector and Extraordinary Minister at the same time/Mass unless absolutely necessary; it is best to understand the two roles as separate and distinct.

<u>Ushers</u>: The ushers serve two roles: first in welcoming the congregation with a warm smile and a kind word, and handing out bulletins at the end of Mass. They can also help people find a seat in the fuller Masses. In addition, they serve as the individuals who "handle the collection" during the offertory. They use the traditional stick-handled baskets and proceed throughout the congregation front to back, starting with the transepts. The center is not done until after the gifts are brought up. Two of the ushers also assist with the center aisle during Communion. Each Mass requires four ushers.

<u>Sacristans</u>: The sacristan organizes and prepares for Mass—making available the liturgical supplies needed for each Mass. This person is comfortable in finding the needed items in the sacristy of the church. Best liturgical practices dictate that all participants will arrive at least a half hour before Mass for set-up and preparations. Each Mass requires one Sacristan with two or three for larger Masses.

<u>Altar Servers</u>: Servers are boys in the Third Grade or higher who have made their First Holy Communion. They assist the priest at the Altar and attend regular training. The number of servers varies per Massfrom two up to seven at the larger Masses.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION

Our posture is often a tip-off to our hospitality and reverence for the Lord. Note the actions of Abraham as he greeted the Lord in the presence of three men who appeared near his tent. He ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them. He bowed to the ground as he met them. He and Sarah, his wife, hastened to prepare a meal and bring food and water to their guests.



In the Gospel story, Jesus' friend Mary sat at His feet in order to listen to Him speak. How do we welcome and reverence the Lord? What do our actions show? Do we remember the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament? How do we welcome the Lord in the Scripture readings?

How do we acknowledge His presence in our brothers and sisters, both at Mass and afterwards? Whether we kneel, stand, or sit in the Lord's presence, may our hearts and minds always be attuned to Him.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The French Revolution is hardly a "treasure" in our story, yet in 1789 it began to dismantle the way the world was organized: feudalism. The collapsed society had three basic divisions: those who work, those who fight, and those who pray. There wasn't a great deal of movement among the ranks, yet one way to move out of the workers and the fighters was in the direction of the folks who prayed. These were the First Estate, the clergy.

One of the key persons in any manor or village was the priest. He could read, at least a bit, and so was the source for pronouncements and news from government and Church. He was assigned to celebrate the sacraments frequently and in conformance with certain rules. Seminaries did not exist before the Reformation. Astute Protestant reformers then forced the Catholic world toward a more educated and able clergy. Before that, young men apprenticed with a priest to learn the essentials, and would be presented to the bishop for

ordination. Other priests emerged from the university system, where students were required to be invested as clerics. Still others were monks, ordained not so much for ministry outside the monastic walls, but to offer Mass only for the intentions of the community's benefactors.


