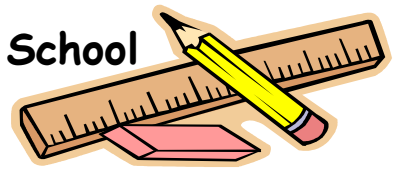

Dress Code Policy for students at the following schools:

Lockard Elementary School

Carver Elementary School

Merritt Jr. High School

Gentry High School

The following dress code applies to the students at Lockard Elementary School, Carver Elementary School, Merritt Jr. High School, and Gentry High School in the city of Indianola for the 2014-2015 school year:

- Maroon/Burgundy Shirts **with a collar – IT MUST BE PLAIN WITH NO SYMBOL OR LOGO OF ANY KIND. Plain, maroon/burgundy shirts must not have any visible brand names or symbols displayed.** The shirt must fit the student appropriately, be buttoned appropriately, and be worn inside pants. The uniform shall not be revealing or excessively tight. Note: Students may continue to wear uniform shirts with the Indianola School District lettering to avoid extra cost to parents/guardians.
- Khaki or **Khaki-Colored Pants** – fitted so as not to sag.
- White T-Shirts **ONLY** under the uniform shirt.
- Black, Khaki, Brown, or Clear Belts **ONLY – Large belt buckles cannot be worn.**
- Black, **Gray**, White, or Brown Gym Shoes, Loafers, or Casual Shoes - The primary or majority of any shoe should be black, **gray**, white, or brown. The following color combinations **WILL NOT BE** allowed: black and red or blue with any other color. Shoes with laces must be laced at all times to avoid safety hazards.
- Shoes **should not be** multicolored, striped, flowered, etc. **Sandals, clogs, flip flops, ballerina shoes, slide-ins, fish-net slippers, house shoes, open-toe sandals, crocs, rubber shoes, jelly shoes, open back shoes, mules, etc. WILL NOT BE permitted. Shoes must be closed heel and toe.**
- Male students will not be permitted to wear earrings nor the big medallion necklaces.
- Male and female students will not be permitted to wear nose rings, navel rings, or other visible body piercings. Male students shall not wear earrings. The earrings for female students can be no larger than a quarter.
- No bandanas, wristbands, do-rags, hand bands of any kind are to be brought to school.
- Hair rollers shall not be worn.
- Use of dark glasses inside the building is limited to students with medical prescriptions.
- Any use of symbols on person, dress, or other school items denoting affiliation with a gang or secret society is prohibited. **THIS INCLUDES COLORED SHOE LACES, UNDER-SHIRTS, AND BELTS.**
- Any accessory or clothing item that advertises drugs, alcoholic
