j) Second grade end of the year math assessment developed and analyzed by the math coach. Students will increase scores.

k) Second grade EOY reading assessment

l) First & second grade financial literacy lessons will be presented monthly by Texas Bank.

m) Early Savers Club-Citizens National Bank- encourage TPS students to save-by coming on campus once a month

n) Implement CLI Engage in Pre-K classes is a user-friendly, technology-driven tool that enables the teacher to assess

a child's progress in a particular skill area almost instantly. This simplistic yet reliable data collection prompts teachers to focus on lessons that target their students' least developed skill areas. CIRCLE Progress Monitoring is listed on the Commissioner's List of Reading Instruments and is aligned with the Head Start Child Development and Early Learning Framework.

o) Morning Announcements: day of the week will have a certain type of message that address a growth mindset, character, inspirational quotes about character traits, thankfulness, and interesting facts submitted by students, teachers, and counselor.

Weekly Announcements: Date/Day of the week, TPS Pledge, US & Texas Pledge, Lunch Menu, and birthdays.

Daily Inspiration: **Mindset Monday**, Growth Mindset, Positive affirmations and mantras to live by. **Train Your Brain Tuesday**- Social/Emotional-character education topics and tips. **Word**
