1 Summer schools shall be organized and operated as a part of the public school program, shall be under  
2 the control and management of the Board, and shall comply with rules and regulations of the State Board  
3 of Education.<sup>1</sup>

4  
5 The summer school program, subject to annual approval by the Board, shall provide opportunities for  
6 remedial instruction, review and limited regular courses at the middle school and high school levels, and  
7 special programs funded by the state and/or federal grants.

8  
9 No class shall be taken for the first time during a summer school session unless the student has maintained  
10 a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 or its equivalent. Students who have a cumulative grade  
11 point average of at least 2.0 or its equivalent may take courses required for graduation for the first time  
12 during a summer school session upon the recommendation of the principal of the school which the student  
13 regularly attends.

14  
15 No more than two (2) units shall be earned during any summer school session.

16  
17 All summer school classes shall meet on school property, and any exceptions must be approved by the  
18 Board. The library, laboratories, and other facilities shall be made available to all students enrolled in the  
19 summer school program.

20  
21 The Board shall annually determine the tuition rates.<sup>2</sup>

22  
23 Three (3) unexcused absences in any course offered during summer school renders a student ineligible  
24 to receive credit in that course.

25  
26 Absences shall be classified as either excused or unexcused as determined by the principal or his/her  
27 designee. Excused absences shall include:

- 28
- 29 1. Personal illness;
  - 30 2. Illness of an immediate family member;
  - 31 3. Death in the family;
  - 32 4. Extreme weather conditions;
  - 33 5. Religious observances; and
  - 34 6. Circumstances which in the judgment of the principal or his/her designee create emergencies over  
35 which the student has no control.
