- 1 Students who have met all graduation requirements on the day of graduation and students who are
- within two (2) or fewer credits of meeting all requirements 1 and can complete the requirements during
- 3 the summer may participate in graduation activities and receive a blank diploma. If extenuating
- 4 circumstances exist at any school, the matter shall be presented to the Board prior to graduation
- 5 activities.
- 6 Students who have not met graduation requirements and who are allowed to participate in graduation
- 7 exercises will not be identified in any way.
- 8 Students are expected to participate in all graduation activities. Graduation apparel shall be determined
- 9 by the administration of each school and shall be the personal expense of each student, except for
- students who are eligible to receive free or reduced price lunches.<sup>2</sup> In such cases, the school shall
- assume responsibility for payment of fees, provided, however, that the school shall not be responsible
- for the expenses of graduation apparel if it consists only of the student's personal clothing. All other
- graduation expenses shall be the responsibility of the Board.
- Graduation ceremonies shall be physically accessible to all students, their parents and/or guardians,
- and other interested citizens.<sup>3</sup>
- 16 Students who do not wish to participate in graduation activities shall make this known to the school
- principal at least five (5) days prior to the day of graduation. Non-participating students will receive
- their diplomas, or certificates, from the principal's office on the day following graduation ceremonies.
- 19 There shall be no sponsorship of a baccalaureate service or other activity which is religious in nature
- by the Board or its employees, and no school funds, including paid staff time, will be used for such
- 21 activities.<sup>4</sup>
- 22 Students graduating with honors and distinction will be recognized at graduation.<sup>5</sup> Honors and
- 23 distinction are defined in accordance with the state's High School Transition Policy as follows:
- 24 Students who score at or above all of the subject area readiness benchmarks on the ACT or equivalent
- 25 score on the SAT will graduate with honors. Students will be recognized as graduating with
- 26 distinction by attaining a B average and completing at least one of the following:
- 27 1. earn a nationally recognized industry certification;
- 28 29
- 2. participate in at least one of the Governor's Schools;

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3. participate in one of the state's All State musical organizations;

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- 4. be selected as a National Merit Finalist or Semi-Finalist;
- 5. attain a score of 31 or higher composite score on the ACT; or

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- 6. earn twelve (12) or more semester hours of transcripted postsecondary credit.
- 8 Students who graduate with honors and/or distinction will be recognized during the graduation
- 9 ceremonies and a seal shall be placed upon their diplomas in recognition of the outstanding
- 10 achievement.
- Additionally, principals shall ensure that high school students who voluntarily complete at least ten
- 12 (10) hours of community service each semester are recognized during the graduation ceremony.
