1 A "home school" is a school conducted or directed by a parent or parents or legal guardian or
 2 guardians for their own children. Home schools which teach K-12 where the parents are associated
 3 with an organization that conducts church-related schools (as defined by §49-50-801) are exempt from
 4 the following provisions, but must follow procedures issued by the State Department of Education.

5 A parent wishing to conduct a home school shall meet the following requirements:¹

- 6 1. Provide annual notice to the superintendent before the commencement of each school year of the
 7 intent to conduct a home school;
- 8 2. Submit to the superintendent the name, number, age, grade level of children involved, location of
 9 the school, curriculum to be offered, proposed hours of instruction, qualifications of the
 10 parent/teacher;
- 11 3. Maintain attendance records, subject to inspection of the local superintendent;
- 12 4. Submit attendance records to the superintendent at the end of each school year;
- 13 5. Provide instruction for at least four (4) hours per day for the same number of instructional days as
 14 are required by state law for public schools;
- 15 6. Possess a high school diploma or GED;
- 16 7. Cooperate in the administration to home school students of appropriate tests by the Commissioner
 17 of Education, his/her designee or by a professional testing service in grades five (5), seven (7), and
 18 nine (9);
- 19 8. Take actions according to state law if home school student falls behind appropriate grade level;
- 20 9. Submit proof to the superintendent that the home school student has been vaccinated as required
 21 by law;
- 22 10. Submit proof to the superintendent that other health services and examinations as required by law
 23 have been received by the home school student; and
- 24 11. In the event of illness or inadequacy of the home school parent-teacher to teach a specific subject,
 25 employ a tutor having the same qualifications as required of parent/teacher.

1 If one or more of these requirements are not met, the Board authorizes the superintendent to take
2 formal action to bring the child into compliance with the compulsory attendance law (until the child
3 has reached age 17), either in the home school or in a public, private or church-related school.

4 It shall be the policy of this Board that public school facilities shall be available for home school
5 instruction only when all of the following conditions exist:

- 6 1. Special needs courses are being taught which require services unavailable to the home school
7 student;
- 8 2. These services cannot be provided through any means other than the public schools;
- 9 3. Requests for services are made known by the home school parent when notice is given to the
10 superintendent of the intent to conduct a home school;
- 11 4. The superintendent investigates request and make recommendations to the Board;
- 12 5. No overcrowding, additional expenses, including providing transportation, or other special
13 situations which interfere with the normal operation of the school system shall be incurred; and
- 14 6. Approval by the Board on a case-by-case basis.

15 The superintendent, through the attendance supervisor, shall have the attendance records of the home
16 school inspected at least two (2) times each school year in order to provide assistance in implementing
17 the Compulsory Attendance Law.

18 If a home school student falls more than one (1) year behind his appropriate grade level in his/her
19 comprehensive test score for two (2) consecutive tests, and if a certified teacher who would have
20 taught the child at his/her grade level determines through appropriate means that the student is not
21 learning disabled, the superintendent shall require the parents to enroll the child in a public, private or
22 church-related school.
