1 In order to ensure a safe and secure learning environment, the following offenses will not be toler-
2 ated:

3 **WEAPONS & DANGEROUS INSTRUMENTS**

4 Students shall not possess, handle, transmit, use or attempt to use any dangerous weapon in school build-
5 ings or on school grounds at any time, or in school vehicles and/or buses or off the school grounds at
6 a school-sponsored activity, function or event.¹

7 Dangerous weapons for the purposes of this policy shall include, but are not limited to a firearm or
8 anything manifestly designed, made or adapted for the purpose of inflicting death or serious bodily
9 injury or anything that in the manner of its use or intended use is capable of causing death or serious
10 bodily injury.²

11 Violators of this section shall be subject to suspension and/or expulsion from school.

12 **Firearms (as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 921)³**

13 In accordance with state law, any student who brings or possesses a firearm on school property shall
14 be expelled for a period of not less than one (1) calendar year. The director of schools shall have the
15 authority to modify this expulsion requirement on a case-by-case basis.⁴

16 **DRUGS**

17 In accordance with state law, any student who unlawfully possesses any drug including any controlled
18 substance or legend drug shall be expelled for a period of not less than one (1) calendar year. The direc-
19 tor of schools shall have the authority to modify this expulsion requirement on a case-by-case basis.⁵

20 **ASSAULT**

21 In accordance with state law, any student who commits aggravated assault as defined in § 39-13-102 upon
22 any teacher, principal administrator, any other employee of the school or school resource officer shall be
23 expelled for a period of not less than one (1) calendar year. The director of schools shall have the authority
24 to modify this expulsion requirement on a case-by-case basis.⁸

25 **ELECTRONIC THREATS**

26 In accordance with state law, any student who transmits by an electronic device any communication
27 containing a credible threat to cause bodily injury or death to another student or school employee and
28 the transmission of such threat creates actual disruptive activity at the school that requires administrative

1 intervention shall be expelled for a period of not less than one (1) calendar year. The director of schools
 2 shall have the authority to modify this expulsion requirement on a case-by-case basis.⁹

4 **BATTERY**

6 In accordance with state law, any student who commits battery upon any teacher, principal administrator,
 7 any other employee of the school or school resource officer shall be expelled for a period of not less than
 8 one (1) calendar year. The director of schools shall have the authority to modify this expulsion requirement
 9 on a case-by-case basis.⁵

11 **ALCOHOL**

13 Consumption, possession, or selling of alcoholic beverages or intoxicants of any kind shall not be permitted
 14 on school-owned property, school buses, at school sponsored activities, or while under school supervision
 15 (including school events off school grounds). Any student who violates this policy shall be subject to
 16 suspension and/or expulsion from school.⁶

19 **NOTIFICATION**

21 When it is determined that a student has violated this policy, the principal of the school shall notify the
 22 student's parent or guardian and the criminal justice or juvenile delinquency system as required by law.⁷
