1 A concussion is a traumatic brain injury caused by a direct or indirect blow to the head or body. In order to ensure
 2 the safety of students that participate in interscholastic athletics, it is imperative that student athletes, coaches, and
 3 parents are educated about the nature and treatment of sports related concussions. The Board recognizes that con-
 4 cussions can be a serious health issue and should be treated as such.

5 The Board adopts the guidelines and other pertinent information and forms developed by the Tennessee Department
 6 of Health to inform and educate coaches, school administrators, student athletes, and parent(s) / guardian(s) of the
 7 nature, risk and symptoms of concussions and head injuries. These guidelines and materials may be viewed on the
 8 Department of Health's website and shall be made available to interested parties through the Central Office.
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10 This policy governs all activities and those individuals involved in those activities which constitute an organized
 11 athletic game or competition against another team or in practice or preparation for an organized game or competition.
 12 It does not govern those activities or individuals involved in those activities which are entered into for instructional
 13 purposes only or those that are incidental to a nonathletic program or lesson.

14 **REQUIRED TRAINING ¹**

15 Information concerning the nature, risk, and symptoms of concussion and head injury should be reviewed by all
 16 administrators, coaches, youth athletes and their parent(s) or guardian(s). The Tennessee Department of Health has
 17 concussion information available online at <http://health.state.tn.us/TBI/concussion.htm>.
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19 The director of schools shall ensure that each school's athletic director, and coaches, employed or volunteer annu-
 20 ally complete a concussion recognition and head injury safety education course program approved by the Tennessee
 21 Department of Health. A currently approved program is the Concussion in Sports —*What You Need to Know* online
 22 course. This course may be accessed online a www.nfhslearn.com.
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24 Prior to the annual initiation of practice or competition, the following persons must review and sign a concussion
 25 and head injury information sheet approved by the Tennessee Department of Health: the director of schools, team
 26 medical provider or health care professional (if appointed), each school athletic director, and each coach, employed
 27 or volunteer.
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29 In addition, prior to the annual initiation of practice or competition, all student athletes and their parent(s) / guardian(s)
 30 shall review the concussion and head injury information sheet approved by the Tennessee Department of Health. A
 31 form confirming this review shall be signed and returned by the student athlete, if the athlete is eighteen (18) years of
 32 age or older; or by the student athlete's parent (s) / guardian (s), for athletes younger than eighteen (18) years of age.
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34 All documentation of the completion of a concussion recognition and head injury safety education course program
 35 and signed concussion and head injury information sheets shall be maintained by the director of schools or his/her
 36 designee for a period of three (3) years.

37 **REMOVAL FROM ATHLETICS ¹**

38 Any student athlete who shows signs, symptoms and/or behaviors consistent with a concussion during an athletic
 39 activity or competition shall be immediately removed for evaluation by a team medical provider or health care pro-
 40 vider, if available, and if not, by the coach or other designated individuals.
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No student athlete who has been removed from an athletic activity or competition due to a concussion or suspected concussion shall be allowed to return to any supervised team activities involving physical exertion, including games, competitions, or practices, until the student athlete has been evaluated by and received written clearance on forms approved by the Department of Health from a licensed health care provider for a full or graduated return. "Health care provider" means a Tennessee licensed medical doctor (M.D.), osteopathic physician (D.O.), or a clinical neuropsychologist with concussion training.

This requirement for clearance prior to a student athlete returning to an athletic activity shall not apply if there is a legitimate explanation other than a concussion for the signs, symptoms, and/or behaviors observed.

The director of schools or his/her designee shall ensure that all protocols approved by the Tennessee Department of Health or required by law relative to the provisions of this policy are followed and implemented within each school.

Jackson-Madison County School System will follow the Tennessee protocol for response of schools/community-based youth athletic organization representatives if players exhibit signs, symptoms of behaviors consistent with a concussion during practice or competition.
