Greene County Schools' personnel will make reasonable efforts to keep special education students and school personnel safe by:

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- 1. Ensuring that special education students will not be subjected to unreasonable, unsafe, and unwarranted isolation and restraint procedures.¹
- 2. Encouraging the use of positive behavioral interventions and supports.²
- 3. Providing staff training on positive behavioral interventions and supports, nonviolent crisis prevention and de-escalation, safe administration of isolation and restraint, and documentation and reporting requirements.³
- 4. Ensuring that personnel are properly trained to protect the student, teacher, and others from physical harm in the event that isolation or restraint is needed.⁴
- 5. Prohibiting the use of an isolation room in which students are left alone in a room that physically prevents the student from leaving (isolation room means a space designed to isolate a student that is unlocked, cannot be locked from the inside, without structural barriers to exit, free of any condition that could be a danger to the student, well ventilated, sufficiently lighted, and where school personnel are direct visual contact with the student at all times. Such spaces must comply with all applicable state and local fire codes).⁵
- 6. Prohibiting the use of chemical restraints as a means of isolation or restraint, unless administered for therapeutic purposes under the direction of a physician and with the parent's consent.6
- 7. Prohibiting the use of noxious substances (noxious substance means a substance released in proximity to the student's face or sensitive area of the body for the purpose of limiting a student's freedom of movement or action, including, but not limited to Mace, or other defense sprays) as a means of isolation or restraint.⁷
- 8. Prohibiting the use of mechanical restraints as means of isolation or restraint.
- 9. Prohibiting the use of life threatening restraint, by chest compression, or any other means.
- 10. Prohibiting the use of coercion, punishment, convenience, or retaliation.¹⁰

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11. Prohibiting the use of a locked door or use of any physical structure that substantially accomplishes the intent of locking a student in a room or structure, to isolate or seclude a student.¹¹

Greene County Schools will not encourage the use of isolation and/or restraint techniques with students. Isolation and restraint will not be used as a disciplinary tool. When the use of restraint or isolation is proposed at an IEP meeting, parents/guardians shall be advised of the provision of T.C.A. §49-10-1301, et seq., this rule and the IDEA Procedural Safeguards. Unless the use of restraints and isolation are included in a student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) that has been agreed upon by the parent, restraint and isolation measures will not be used except in emergency situations (emergency situation means that a child's behavior places the child or others at risk of violence or injury if no intervention occurs), where the student is a clear and present danger to himself or others, including personnel and the use will only occur as a last resort when less restrictive measures have proven to be ineffective. ¹²

The following physically holding restraints are not prohibited and do not require the completion of a report form or parent notification:

1. Use of restraints for medical immobilization, adaptive support, or medical protection. 13

2. The brief holding by an adult in order to calm or comfort a student. 14

3. Minimum contact necessary to physically escort a student from one area to another. 15

4. Assisting a student in completing a task or response if the student does not resist, or resistance is minimal in intensity or duration.¹⁶

5. Holding a student for a brief time in order to prevent any impulsive behavior that threatens the student's immediate safety. 17

The following physically holding restraints are not prohibited but do require the completion of a report form and parent notification:

1. Actions by school personnel to break up a fight. 18

2. Actions by school personnel to take a weapon from a student. 18
