1 A cumulative record shall be kept for each student enrolled in school. The folder shall contain a health
2 record, attendance record, and scholarship record; shall be kept current; and shall accompany the student
3 through his/her school career.¹

4 The name used on the record of the student entering the school system must be the same as that shown
5 on the birth certificate, unless evidence is presented that such name has been legally changed. If the
6 parent does not have, or cannot obtain a birth certificate, then the name used on the records of such
7 student shall be as shown on documents which are acceptable as proof of date of birth.

8 The name used on the records of a student entering the system from another school must be the same as
9 that shown on records from the school previously attended unless evidence is presented that such name
10 has been legally changed as prescribed by law.

11 When a student transfers and his/her records are requested from another school within the system, the
12 school shall send the original records to the transfer school.²

13 When a student transfers and his/her records are requested from a school outside the system, the school
14 shall keep the original records and send copies to the transfer school.²

15 Attendance records kept on each student become permanent property of the school system.

16 Student records shall be confidential. Only authorized school officials may have access to student
17 information for legitimate educational purposes without the consent of the student or parent/guardian.²

18 All records shall be remitted in accordance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

19 **ACCESS TO STUDENT RECORDS**

20 Student records shall be confidential. Authorized school officials shall have access to and permit access
21 to student education records for legitimate educational purposes.³ A “legitimate educational interest” is
22 the official’s need to know information in order to:

- 23 1. Perform required administrative tasks;
- 24 2. Perform a supervisory or instructional task directly related to the student’s education; and
- 25 3. Perform a service or benefit for the student or the student’s family such as health care, counseling,
26 student job placement, or student financial aid.

1 Authorized school officials may release information from or permit access to a student's education record
2 without the parent(s) or eligible student's* prior written consent in the following instances:

- 3 1. To comply with a judicial order or lawfully issued subpoena. The school system will make a
4 reasonable effort to notify the student's parent(s) or the eligible student before making a
5 disclosure;⁴

- 7 2. If the disclosure is an item of directory information;⁵
8
- 9 3. To comply with the requirements of child abuse reports to the extent known by the school
10 officials including the name, address, and age of the child; the name and address of the person
11 responsible for the care of the child, and the facts requiring the report;⁶
12
- 13 4. When certain federal and state officials need information in order to audit or enforce legal
14 conditions related to federally-supported education programs in the school system;⁷
15
- 16 5. When the school system has entered into a contract or written agreement for an organization to
17 conduct scientific research on the system's behalf to develop tests or improve instruction,
18 provided that the studies are conducted in a manner which will not permit the personal
19 identification of students and their parents by individuals other than representatives of the
20 organization and the information will be destroyed when no longer needed for the purpose for
21 which the study was conducted;⁸
22
- 23 6. To appropriate officials if the parent(s) claim the student as a dependent as defined by the
24 Internal Revenue Code;⁹
25
- 26 7. To accrediting organizations to carry out their accrediting functions;¹⁰
27
- 28 8. When a student seeks or intends to enroll in another school district or a post-secondary school.
29 Parent(s) of students or eligible students have a right to obtain copies of records transferred
30 under this provision;¹¹
31
- 32 9. To financial institutions or government agencies that provide or may provide financial aid to a
33 student in order to establish eligibility, to determine the amount of financial aid, to establish
34 conditions for the receipt of financial aid, and to enforce financial aid agreements;¹²
35
- 36 10. To make the needed disclosure in a health or safety emergency when warranted by the
37 seriousness of the threat to the student or other persons, when the information is necessary and
38 needed to meet the emergency, when time is an important and limiting factor, and when the
39 persons to whom the information is to be disclosed are qualified and in a position to deal with
40 the emergency;¹³
41
- 42 11. To the Attorney General or his designee for official purposes related to the investigation or
43 prosecution of an act of domestic or international terrorism. An educational agency that, in
44 good faith, produces education records in accordance with an order issued under this Act shall
45 not be liable to any person for that production;¹⁴

1 12. To any agency caseworker or other representative of a state or local child welfare agency or
 2 tribal organization authorized to access the student's educational records when such agencies or
 3 organizations are legally responsible for the care and protection of the student;¹⁵

4 Authorized school officials may release information from a student's education record if the student's
 5 parent(s) or the eligible student gives written consent for the disclosure. The written consent must
 6 include:¹⁶

- 7 1. A specification of the records to be released;
- 8 2. The reasons for the disclosure;
- 9 3. The person, organization, or class of persons or organizations to whom the disclosure is to be
 10 made;
- 11 4. The signature of the parent(s) or eligible student;
- 12 5. The date of the consent and, if appropriate, a date when the consent is to be terminated. The
 13 student's parent(s) or the eligible student* may obtain a copy of any records disclosed under this
 14 provision.

15 The school system will maintain an accurate record of all requests to disclose information from or to
 16 permit access to a student's education records. The system will maintain an accurate record of
 17 information it discloses and access it permits. The system will maintain this record as long as it maintains
 18 the student's education record.¹⁷

19 The record will include at least:¹⁷

- 20 1. The name of the person or agency that makes the request;
- 21 2. The interest the person or agency has in the information;
- 22 3. The date the person or agency makes the request; and
- 23 4. Whether the request is granted and, if it is, the date access is permitted or the disclosure is made.

24 * *The student becomes an "eligible student" when he/she reaches age 18 or enrolls in a post-secondary*
 25 *school, at which time all of the above rights become the student's right.*
