SCHOOL BOARD GOVERNANCE

The Tyler County Board of Education has defined their major responsibilities as centering around four (4) functions:

1. To set a vision for education--including the adoption of goals and strategies-- with broad community participation;
2. To establish a structure for school governance that requires a collaborative effort and works through a strategic-planning process;
3. To create an accountability system that includes a provision for staff and board training; and
4. To advocate for the educational needs and interests of students with the communities and among other government agencies and legislative bodies. To this end Board members need to form public opinion.

These four functions- vision, structure, accountability, and advocacy--will help the Board to focus on activities to improve the educational program in Tyler County.
