

TYLER COUNTY POLICY: IY

SUMMER SCHOOL

The Tyler County Board of Education may submit to the West Virginia Board of Education an application to operate a summer school. If approved then credit can be granted if the instructional program is equivalent to that required in the regular school term. The Tyler County Board may operate a summer school program at the parent's expense, for any of the following purposes:

1. To provide any opportunity for high school students to repeat a required course that they failed during the regular school term.
2. To provide an opportunity for students who need to earn a 2.0 GPA to participate in an SSAC sanctioned fall sport; or
3. To offer Driver Education.

A student may attend at parent's expense, an approved summer school program in another county, which has been certified and approved by the West Virginia State Board of Education, in order to earn a credit for a course in which he or she did not pass during the regular school year. Once the principal has received official notification of a passing grade, credit may be awarded.

If a senior fails a course needed in order to graduate, that student may earn the necessary credit by successfully completing the course through an approved summer school. However, that student is not eligible to participate in the graduation ceremony and the diploma will not be issued until the principal receives appropriate verification.

Basic skills remediation classes may be offered, if funds permit, to students in grades K-8.

Extended School Year Special Education and related services shall be provided to an eligible student with a disability, in accordance with the student's IEP, and that meets the eligibility criteria set forth in State Board Policy 2419: Regulations for the Education of Exceptional Students. These services shall be provided at no cost to the parents.
