

IMMUNIZATIONS AND BIRTH CERTIFICATE

All students enrolling in Tyler County Schools for the first time are required to provide proof prior to their first day of attendance that immunizations and proof of identity meet West Virginia's minimum standards as explained in West Virginia Code Sections 16-3-4, 16-3-5, and 18-2-5c. Any student unable to provide proof that all state requirements have been met will be denied attendance until such proof is provided and placed in the student's permanent record file.

Before admission in grades Pre-K through 12, the requirements are as follows:

*NEEDED FOR PRE-K

Immunization	Doses Required	Comments
Tdap	4	Booster after 4 th birthday
IPV	3	Booster after 4 th birthday
Hepatitis B	3	Final dose at age 24 weeks or older
Varicella	1	After 1 st birthday- 2 doses required for kindergarten
MMR	1	After 1 st birthday- 2 doses required for kindergarten

*7th and 12th graders must show proof of Tdap and Meningitis shots.

*12th graders, a Meningitis Booster Shot is required if the child had the shot before their 16th birthday.

Before admission in Pre-K, all children should be age appropriately immunized with Tdap, IPV, Hepatitis B, Varicella, and MMR. This information must be received prior to the first day of school. If we haven't received the information, your child will be placed on a waiting list until the information is provided.

Failure to provide documentation that requirements have been met may result in referral of the case to the county Attendance Director for further investigation and legal action, as appropriate.

Out-of-state transfer students and students in foster care may

be provisionally enrolled and permitted to attend if documentation is provided that at least one(1) dose of each required vaccine has been administered. Such students may have ninety (90) days from the date of enrollment to provide satisfactory documentation that all state requirements have been met for immunizations and to provide the school with a certified copy of the child's birth certificate that bears the raised seal of the West Virginia Department of Health Division of Vital Statistics and the Divisions registration number.

Policy 2423, Communicable Disease Control, require all immunizations to be entered into WVEIS.
