

TYLER COUNTY POLICY: JX

STUDENT CONDUCT ON BUSES

Tyler County students have a right to be transported to and from school by means of a public school bus, in a safe and efficient manner. School officials have responsibility for students' safety and welfare from the time they board the bus or arrive at school until they are returned to their designated bus stop. Students' right to ride a school bus, however, also requires them to observe all bus rules.

Students shall receive a copy of the bus rules and the bus operator will review those rules with them annually during the first week of school. Transfer students who enroll in Tyler County Schools for the first time, after the first week of school, shall receive a copy of the rules when they initially begin riding a bus.

Bus operators shall enforce the rules fairly and consistently. Violations shall be reported to the Transportation Director and, if warranted, the student will be suspended from the bus for a specified period of time. Reinstatement shall be granted when an understanding of acceptable behavior has been reached by the student.

Specific procedures and rules related to student transportation can be found in the Tyler County Schools' Administrative Procedures Manual.
