

POST-SECONDARY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

The Tyler County Board of Education believes that the establishment of alliances between Tyler County Schools and post-secondary institutions works to everyone's mutual benefit. Professors from institutions of higher education can help keep public school educators informed regarding current research in instructional techniques and learning theory. They may also be utilized as consultants, trainers, advisors, and resource personnel in classrooms.

The Tyler County Board of Education also recognizes its obligation to assist the teacher training institutions in preparing new teachers for their profession by allowing student teachers to gain their laboratory experiences in our schools.

College or university education programs that wish to place either student observers or student teachers in any Tyler County classroom must first obtain annual permission from the Tyler County Board of Education through a letter of request to the Superintendent. Following approval of the Board, articulation agreements will be required between the education program field-coordinator and the supervising teacher and principal.
