- are awaiting foster care placement;
- have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings;
- are living in cars, parks, public places, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and
- migrant children and youth (as defined under NCLB Title IC Migrant Education) who qualify as homeless for the purposes of this subtitle because the children are living in circumstances described above.

Your student may qualify for assistance!

Assistance may include:

- School supplies, school clothes
- Fees (SAT, ACT, college applications, credit recover etc.)
- Homework assistance
- Violence prevention resources
- Emergency assistance to attend school
- Transportation
- One-time emergency expenses that will result in student being able to attend and participate in school (immunizations, glasses), and/or emergencies
