PETITION CLOSING OF A ROAD

To the petitioner's knowledge, granting of this petition will not affect the ownership of right of convenient access of persons owning other land located or abutting the right-of-way, if any. Additionally, this road is not a part of any state or federal highway and is not acquired or dedicated for state or federal purposed. All taxes have been paid.

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ROAD CLOSING

1. Provide, in writing, a formal petition requesting that a particular road be closed. Request should be accompanied with a \$200.00 check to pay for advertising before the Board of County Commissioners.
2. Submit with a deed to all lots showing ownership of all lots by the petitioner.
3. Submit evidence of paid taxes on each lot.
4. These items will be submitted to the Planning Commission through the Washington County Planning Department for an informal review process. No public hearing is required at this point.
5. After review, the Planning Commission will:
 - a. Outline the regulatory steps to be taken in vacating this particular plan (with regards to surveys, filling and approval of new plat, posting of bond, etc.).
 - b. Issue a recommendation to the Washington County Board of County Commissioners, with instructions to the Planning Department to proceed with legal advertisement.
6. The Planning Department will submit a legal ad to the local news publication for two weekly issues of the newspaper advertising that such vacation of the plat will be considered at a public hearing before the Commission at a regular meeting of the Board.
7. A public hearing will then be held as described above. You will be notified about the date.
8. If approved by the Board of County Commissioners, the Clerk of Court will then advertise for adoption of a resolution.
