BID NAME: Request for Bid for the Washington County Annual Lime rock Contract.

DESCRIPTION: The Washington County Board of Commissioners is seeking qualified vendors to respond to this Request for Bid for the purchase of #57 lime rock meeting FDOT Standard Specification for the purpose of completing FEMA projects for the repair of various county roads, along with any other public works projects that the County sees fit to accomplish. The bid shall include the location of the mine at which the lime rock will be available for pickup by the County and/or its contractor. The bidder shall be responsible for loading all materials and shall supply sufficient equipment necessary to load the materials onto a dump truck or semi for hauling by the County and/or its contractor. Additionally, the bidder may provide as an additional option to be considered by the County as part of its bid, the delivery price for hauling the lime rock from the bidder's mine to a County designated facility located within Washington County, Florida for stockpiling if the lime rock is purchased from the bidder. The delivery price shall be submitted on a per mile per ton basis. It shall be the responsibility of the bidder to supply job duplicate tickets for each load. The job ticket shall include the following information:

- Ticket number
- County job name
- Type of material being hauled
- Quantity of material being hauled (IN TONS)
- Contractor's truck number
- Contractor's drivers name and signature of the contractor's driver and county representative signature
- A copy of this job ticket shall be attached to contractor's invoice for payment. The contractor understands the County shall not pay for any loads that do not have a job ticket associated with it.

The successful bidder shall, if requested, have available for County pickup the requested material within twenty four (24) hours at the bidder's plant site. If the material is to be purchased from and delivered by the bidder to a County designated facility, the requested material shall be delivered within seventy two (72) hours of being ordered.

BID OPENING:

Bids will be publicly opened at **3:00 P.M. CST on January 9, 2020** in the Washington County Board of County Commissioners Board Room at 1331 South Blvd., Chipley, FL 32428.

Bids SHALL be submitted in a sealed envelope and marked what the bid is for.

A sealed copy of test results from a certified testing laboratory verifying qualifying percentages of Calcium Carbonate (CaCO₃) and Magnesium Carbonate (MgCO₃) must be submitted with the bid as well as a sealed copy of FM 5-515 test results from a certified laboratory. All tests results shall not be greater than 90 days old on the bid submission date.

The Washington County Board of County Commissioners reserves the right to waive informalities in any bid, to accept and/or reject any or all bids, and to accept the bid in their judgment that will be in the best interest of Washington County which will take into consideration County transportation costs of material to Washington County.

EEO STATEMENT

GENERAL

- A. These documents constitute the complete set of specification requirements and bid forms. Bidders are required to comply with all provisions of Federal, State and County laws and Ordinances, rules and regulations, which are applicable to the items being bid. Lack of knowledge by the bidder shall in no way be a cause for relief from responsibility, or constitute a cognizable defense against the legal effect thereof.

Bidder shall also hold a current license to conduct work in the State of Florida. They shall also maintain "in Effect", any and all licenses required to successfully accomplish the task required in the Request for Bid. It is the vendor's responsibility to ascertain what licenses are required, and to insure that they in fact currently have or obtain, before start of work, the proper licensure for the job.

The contractor/vendor shall adhere to all applicable health and safety laws regulations including, but not limited to, those promulgated by the state and federal government.

PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES

The County of Washington is exempt from Federal and State Taxes for tangible personal property. The Clerk of Court Office will supply the successful bidder with an exemption certificate if required. Vendors or contractors doing business with Washington County shall not be exempted from paying sales tax to their suppliers for materials to fulfill contractual obligations with the County, nor shall any Vendor/Contractor be authorized to use the County Tax Exemption Number in securing such materials.

ACCEPTANCE/REJECTION

Washington County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids and make the award to that bidder, who in the opinion of the County will be in the best interest of and/or the most advantageous to the County. The County also reserves the right to reject the bid of any vendor who has previously failed in the proper performance of an award or to deliver on time contracts of a similar nature or who is not in a position to perform properly under this award. The County reserves the right to inspect all facilities of bidders in order to make a determination as to the forgoing. Washington County reserves the right to waive any irregularities and technicalities and may, at its discretion, request a rebid.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The award is subject to provisions of State Statutes and County Ordinances if any. All bidders must disclose with their bid the name of any officer, director, or agent who is an employee of Washington County. Further, all bidders must disclose the name of any County employee who own, directly or indirectly, an interest of ten percent (10%) or more in the bidders firm or any of its branches.

MISTAKES

In the event of extension error(s), the unit price will prevail and the bidder's total offer will be corrected accordingly. In the event of addition errors, the extended totals will prevail and the bidder's total will be corrected accordingly. Bidders must check their bid proposal where applicable. Failure to do so will be at the bidder's risk. Bids having erasures or corrections must be initialed in blue ink by the bidder.

AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS

The obligations of Washington County under this award are subject to the availability of funds lawfully appropriated for its purpose by the State of Florida and Washington County.

QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS

Bid will be considered only from firms engaged in providing/performing products/services specified herein. Bidder must have adequate organization, facilities, equipment and personnel to ensure prompt and efficient service, or they must be able to show that they have the ways and means to fulfill the obligations of service or other services related to the product /service. Bidder must submit proof of adequate insurance for any hauling of the lime rock by the Bidder. The Board will determine whether the evidence of ability to perform is satisfactory and reserves the right to reject bids where evidence submitted, or investigated and evaluation indicated inability of the bidder to perform.

AWARD OF BID: The Board reserves the right to award any and all bids to the "Lowest Responsible and Responsive Bidder". The term Lowest Responsible and Responsive bidder is defined below. The Board also reserves the right to award the contract to more than one bidder, as determined to be in the best interest of the County.

RESPONSIBLE BIDDER: The word "responsible" generally includes attributes of trustworthiness; fitness and capacity of low bidder to satisfactorily perform the proposed work, or supply the required materials.

RESPONSIVE BIDDER: The word "responsive" is generally interpreted to mean the bidder has met the minimum requirements and specifications of the bid solicitation.

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS

This invitation to bid contemplates the furnishing of DOT Specification 911 lime rock on an "AS NEEDED" basis to Washington County to begin upon Board approval and ending one year from original date of approval. Washington County does not guarantee quantities to be purchased during the period listed herein. The County may, at its sole option, purchase more or less than the estimated annual consumption from this contract depending upon its needs. The bid shall include the location of the mine at which the lime rock will be available. Additionally, the bidder may provide as an additional option to be considered by the County as part of its bid, the delivery price for hauling the lime rock to a County designated facility located within Washington County, Florida for stockpiling if the lime rock is purchased from the bidder. The delivery price shall be submitted on a per mile per ton basis from the bidder's mine.

The successful bidder shall, if requested, have available for County pickup the requested material within twenty four (24) hours at the bidder's plant site. If the material is to be purchased from and delivered by the bidder the requested material shall be delivered within seventy two (72) hours of being ordered.

All material must meet or exceed the specifications attached for DOT 911 lime rock.

Washington County may choose to random sample and test material throughout the contract period. Should it be determined that any quantity of material purchased does not meet the specifications herein, such material must be refunded by the seller for the full purchase price. Failure to meet the above provisions shall be deemed sufficient cause by the County to cancel any contract or agreement entered into under the provisions of this bid.

During the term of this agreement, the County will from time to time monitor material pricing from sources other than the contract supplier. Should the County in

the County's sole judgment find that the pricing from the contract supplier is non-representative of the market; the County shall have the option to renegotiate the contract with the supplier. If an agreement cannot be reached within five (5) working days after the County has notified the contract supplier of its intent to renegotiate pricing, the County shall have the option to cancel this agreement giving thirty (30) days written notice.

SECTION 911
BASE AND STABILIZED BASE MATERIALS

911-1 Description.

This Section governs materials to be used in the construction of base and subgrade stabilization including lime rock, shell, shell-rock, cemented coquina shell, and recycled concrete aggregate (RCA).

911-2 Materials.

911-2.1 General:

911-2.1.1 Approval of Material: Approval of mineral aggregate sources shall be in accordance with 6-2.3.

911-2.1.2 Deleterious Substances: Materials shall not contain deleterious substances that would result in: prevention of the bituminous prime coat from adhering to the base course; a detriment to the finishing, strength, or performance of the base; or a surface which is susceptible to distortion under construction traffic. Such substances include, but are not limited to: cherty or other extremely hard pieces, lumps, balls or pockets of sand or clay size material, organic matter, loose sand, loose, free shells, corals or skeletal remain of other marine invertebrates retained on the No. 4 sieve, or water sensitive clay minerals.

911-2.3 Lime rock Composition: Lime rock material shall consist of unconsolidated or partly consolidated limestone of marine origin.

911-2.4 Shell Material: Composition: Shell materials shall consist of naturally occurring deposits formed essentially of broken mollusk shell, corals and the skeletal remains of other marine invertebrates. Live or steamed shell, or man-made deposits as a by-product of the shellfish industry will not be permitted.

911-2.4.1 Bank Run Shell: Shell materials meeting the requirements of this Section which are presently found as "dry land" deposits.

911-2.4.2 Dredged Shell: Shell materials meeting the requirements of this Section which are dredged from ocean, bay or lake deposits.

911-2.5 Shell-Rock Material Composition: Shell-rock materials shall consist of naturally occurring heterogeneous deposits of limestone with interbedded layers or lenses of loose and cemented shell, to include cemented sands (calcitic sandstone). This material shall be mined and processed in a manner that will result in a reasonably homogenous finished product.

911-2.6 Cemented Coquina Shell Material Composition: Cemented coquina shell materials to be used as cemented coquina base or stabilized base, shall be defined as naturally occurring deposits formed essentially of broken mollusk shell, corals and the skeletal remains of other marine invertebrates, which are presently found as "dry land" deposits and which have been cemented together by carbonates or other natural cementing agents.

911-2.7 Recycled Concrete Aggregate (RCA) Composition: RCA shall consist of concrete material derived from the crushing of hard portland cement concrete. In addition to the deleterious materials noted in 911-2. 2, RCA shall be asbestos free. The following limits shall not be exceeded:
