Webb City High School Scholar and Athlete

Attended the University of Missouri, University of Oklahoma, the Teacher's College of Columbia, and Columbia University, both in New York and the University of Tulsa School of Journalism where she began her career as a writer by selling a term paper to the *Tulsa World*.

Highly involved in research about the history of Native Americans first in the Gilcrease Museum in Tulsa and later at the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, D.C., and the British Museum leading to the publication of the following books:
