

Hello Families and Staff Members,

A key document in this work will be the Board's new Vision of the Graduate ratified by the Board in September 2017. All of our work to come will be guided by this document as we work to "unpack" it into specific plans at the school, department, and teacher levels. The introduction of the Vision is very important to understand. It is important to note that this vision encompasses a child's thirteen-year journey through our school system. The word 'graduate' should not be interpreted to pertain only to high school students. We will be working on getting all of the skills and dispositions laid out later in the document into all of our curricula, teaching methods, and experiences from kindergarten through grade twelve. Wolcott High School:

Fifty-Seven students from our Model United Nations Club traveled to New York CIty and the United Nations to meet with ambassadors from Israel, Turkey, Belgium and Greece. The Israeli group was given a private tour of the United Nations by the Israeli Delegates. All of our students are now in the process of writing UN Resolutions on the following topics: Nuclear

Proliferation, Walls as Borders, Current Refugee Crisis, Funding of Terrorism, Access to medication and immunizations for developing world, Access to Education for 58 million children currently not enrolled in school, Cyber Terrorism and the Depletion of Natural Resources. We wish them luck in their work preparing for the Model UN summit they will be attending.

The Wolcott High School learning community has begun our Self Reflection process in



association with the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. This is an arduous examination of our total school and requires us to compare our practices to five rigorous standards. As previously reported, we

have entered into an agreement with NEASC to utilize and pilot the new 2020 standards for this self-reflection. The Self-Reflection will be completed by the spring and we will develop a school growth plan that will be used to monitor our progress on improvement goals we establish based on the Self-Reflection. We will work on our goals in the time prior to the ten year visit in November of 2019. I will be updating you on this process periodically over the next two years. I want to thank all of our staff members who have embraced this process especially our co-chairs Steven Jasulavic and Michelle Thies.

Student Services:

Fourth grade students of Mrs. D'Ettore at Frisbie Elementary School were sworn in on Thursday, September 21st as this year's WeeDeliver Postal Workers.

Each Friday morning, students in the special education program and a peer helper are responsible for the collecting, sorting by zip code and delivering mail from classroom to classroom. Additionally, students proofread each letter to make sure writers have used proper formatting and cancel stamps as "Received" or "Return to Sender". These jobs incorporate reading, writing, math and socialization skills. Once they have been trained in each position, they are responsible for the job training of their peers in fourth and fifth grade.

Student Learning & Teaching:

New Targeted Support for Struggling Learners! District-wide math and ELA support personnel attended a live webinar presentation from representatives of I-Ready on Nov 8th. The webinar introduced the group to a new web-based tool that can be used for additional support for



students who are struggling in math and ELA. The program is referred to as the I-Ready Personalized Instructional Pathways. The program uses the results of the I-Ready Diagnostic Assessment to set-up a customizable bank of online lessons for students to navigate in order to build a greater understanding of the skills and concepts in the following areas: Foundational Reading, Reading Comprehension: Literature and Informational Text, Number and Operations, Algebraic Thinking, Measurement, and Geometry. Students in grades 1-10 will begin engaging in the online pathways by the end of November. The additional online support will be delivered outside of the traditional classroom setting and participating students will be encouraged to engage for at least 45 minutes each week. ENERGY STAR AWARDS FOR ALL FIVE SCHOOLS!
