Guest staying at the Shelter receives a shower, breakfast and supper, clothing vouchers to the Saint Vincent DePaul Thrift Store and lunch at the Saint Vincent DePaul Soup Kitchen. Five full time case workers assist the guest with employment and apartment searches. Guests are also referred to addiction or health clinics at the Homeless Shelter guest's request.
