**evidence**— pieces of items or information that prove something to be true

# figurative language

Alliteration: repetition of the first consonant sounds in several words (tongue twisters)

Ex: Betty bought butter but the butter was bitter.

Onomatopoeia: a sound divide where the words sound like their meaning or mimic a sound.

Ex: Knock! Knock! Knock!

Briiiiiinnngggggg!

Simile: compares two unlike things using like or as.

Ex: I move fast like a cheetah.

She's as happy as a lark.

Metaphor: compares two unlike things without using like or as.

Ex: The coffee shop is an icebox!
