figurative language

1. Idiom: a form of expression that is particular to a certain group of people
Ex: I'm all ears. (You have my full attention.)
Ex: It cost an arm and a leg. (It was expensive.)
2. Hyperbole: an outrageous exaggeration
Ex: The shopping trip cost me a million dollars.
Ex: I'm so hungry I could eat a horse.
3. Personification: gives human qualities to objects or animals
Ex: Lightning danced across the sky.
Ex: Sam heard the last piece of pizza calling his name.
4. Symbolism: occurs when a word has its' own meaning but it represents something different
Ex: He was my rock. (Represents someone being dependable)
Ex: Life's a roller coaster. (Represents life being full of ups and downs)
